KEYNOTE SPEAKER AND BENEFACTOR DONOR





Welcome, Colin Kaminski, keynote speaker for the 2023 Bluebonnet Brew-Off. Colin, co-author of Water: A Comprehensive Guide for Brewers (Brewers Publications, 2013), discovered brewing while briefly dating a woman with a degree in fermentation science from UC Davis. Using one of his first three batches of homebrew, Kaminski applied and was hired at Beer, Beer and More Beer as a product designer. While there, he designed more than 180 products including their Peltier cooled conical fermenter. In 2003, he became the master brewer at Downtown Joe's Brewery and has brewed more than 800 7bbl batches in nine years as the head of a one-man department. Colin has written on a variety of topics including lutherie, holography, solar astronomy and beer. He was awarded the Beer Writers Guild Feature of the Year Award for his *Brew Your Own* article "Bring on the Heat".


Brewers' Roundtable

AWARDS

Category Winners:

All first place category winners will receive a commemorative stein and a first place medal. Second and third place winners will receive a medal.

Best of Show:

There will be a first place best of show for beer and a first place best of show for mead and cider. Each winner will receive a special award.

Brewers of the Year (Individual and Team) The homebrewer accumulating the most placement points for Individually submitted entries from categories 51 - 88 will be recognized as the Bluebonnet Homebrewer of the Year. Points are awarded as follows:

1st place – 3 points; 2nd place – 2 points; 3rd place – 1 point., The homebrew team accumulating the most placement points for a named team's submitted entries from categories 51 – 88 will be recognized as the Bluebonnet Homebrew Team of the Year. Points are awarded as follows: 1st place – 3 points; 2nd place – 2 points; 3rd place – 1 point

The Bluebonnet Trophy: The Homebrew Club receiving the most placement points, both from Individually and Team submitted entries on behalf of the Club, in categories 51-93, will be awarded the Bluebonnet Cup. In case of a Tie, the tie breakers will be in the following order: Most 1st place winners, then most 2nd place winners, then most 3rd place winners. A coin toss will settle any further tie.

BBO Peoples' Choice Voting will be done by all in attendance at the home brew tasting event following the awards ceremony. Each attendee will vote for their favorite **club**, using colored poker chips, based on the quality of the beers served by that club. To avoid bias toward the larger clubs, club members will not be permitted to vote for their own club. Be sure to taste the offerings and cast your vote in the first hour of the homebrew tasting. Winners will be announced once voting is complete.

BBO Pro-Am Brewing

Starting in 2015, local professional brewers have selected among Best of Show entrants to brew a stein winning beer on a commercial scale. The "amateurs" find it very rewarding to have the opportunity to scale their recipe up and see it served at brewery tap rooms for all to enjoy

North Texas Homebrew Circuit: The North Texas Homebrew Circuit is homebrew competition circuit promoting and assisting the local North Texas Homebrew Clubs with their Homebrew Competitions. The Homebrewer of the year and Team of the year awards are sponsored by the Bluebonnet Brewoff and will be presented at the following year's Bluebonnet Brewoff Awards ceremony. Events include the Celtic Brewoff (Knights of the Brown Bottle), Spirit of '76 (Horsemen of the Hopocalypse), Limbo Challenge (N. Texas Homebrewers Association), O'Zapaft Is (Cap and Hare), Redcoat Challenge (Denton County Homerbrewers Guild), Belgian Drafthorse (Horsemen of the Hopocalypse), Santa Bee (Cap and Hare).

Lone Star Circuit: The mission of the Lone Star Circuit is to actively promote and support the homebrew clubs, contests, and homebrewers of Texas." These awards will be announced at the end of the Dixie Cup Competition for the accumulation of points for the competition year: "Lone Star Homebrewer of the Year" for the single homebrewer that earns the most total points for the competitions; "Lone Star Homebrew Team of the Year" for the homebrew team that earns the most total points for the competitions; and "Lone Star Homebrew Club of the Year" for the homebrew club that earns the most total points for the competitions. The competitions included in the Lone Star Circuit are Bluebonnet Brew-off, Lunar Rendezbrew, Belgian Brew Brawl, KGB Big Batch Brew Bash, Alamo City Cerveza Fest, Operation Fermentation. Austin Homebrew Inquisition, Limbo Challenge, Spirit of '76, and Dixie Cup.

The points will be awarded as follows: 3-2-1 points will be awarded 1st-2nd-3rd place medals respectively (the KGB competition will be an exception awarding points as 8-6-4-2-1 for 1st-2nd-3rd-1st HM-2nd HM as long as it remains single style). Also, non-standard style categories will not receive points such as "wine and liquor" at Lunar Rendezbrew, "New Entrants" at Bluebonnet and Dixie Cup, and "Special Categories" at Dixie Cup. Ties are allowed; there are no tie-breakers. See http://www.lonestarcircuit.com.





The Bankhead highway was one of the first transcontinental highways built in 1916 that ran from Washington D.C to San Diego. The route included 850 miles through Texas, including a span through downtown Rowlett. You can even see the three original three bridges from the old highway peeking out of Lake Ray Hubbard, just south of Highway 66. One of the first of its kind, the Bankhead highway was a pioneering venture and proof of American ingenuity and progress. Today, one hundred years later, Bankhead Brewing uses that same spirit to craft delicious, local-made, artisanal beer.





Lakewood Brewing Company was founded in 2011, but the inspiration behind our family-owned craft brewery began long ago. I was born in Belgium and moved to North Texas when I was 7 years old. Growing up, we took regular trips to visit family in Belgium which lead to a great appreciation for the craftsmanship and unique flavors found in beer. I graduated from SMU in Dallas when craft beer was still in it's infancy. My beer journey began with the search for a taste from Belgium here in Texas. That search led me to discover American craft breweries that were pushing beer boundaries. During that time I moved to East Dallas and found a part of the city that is full of creative people putting their energy back into the community. From the classic Art Deco Lakewood Theater, to over the top block parties, I fell in love with this invigorated neighborhood, and the vibe that came with it. It wasn't long before I dove head first into home-brewing and after the first few brews, the train had left the station and there was no turning back.




